4. Program:

The theme of the NJSP Camp-O-REE is "Saluting our Gold Star Mothers". Our involvement with this aspect of the NJSP Camp-O-REE is not known as they are still developing the program. We will let you know what, if anything is required from our scouts as we are informed.

The program will emphasize a minimization of speeches and maximize interaction and participation of scouts, scouters, NJ State police and NJ National Guardsmen. The Saturday night show will also minimize the speech and focus on introductions, recognition, and entertainment.

The New Jersey National Guard will be offering their *Top Physical Challenge* to approximately 20 scouts from each council. Scouts must be at least 13 years or older. The challenge takes about 2 hours to complete. Time and place of the competition will be made know to all units as soon as we know.

Color Guard Competition. This is another program which will be conducted by the New Jersey National Guard. Each Troop is encouraged to develop a Color Guard unit to compete in the program. The National Guard will be judging the competition and making the awards to the winners. The trophies presented to the color guard winner's will be given in memory of a NJ State Police Troopers son who was killed in Iraq. Obviously, to be competitive, units should start their practice drilling without delay.

A 2007 NJSP Camp-O-Ree Fact Sheet is included for your reference.

The 2011 requirements, time and place of the competition will be made know to all units as soon as we know.

Scoutmasters have not been apprised of both of these programs. We need to let them know ASAP and encourage their participation.

VIP's are being invited to this event. We are expecting an updates list of RSVP's weekly. And speaking of VIP's, Chief Scout Executive Bob Mazzucca will be at the NJSP Camp-O-Ree on Saturday morning. He will be hosting an Eagle Scout reception Saturday morning.

He will distribute a commemorative coin to youth Eagle Scouts ONLY.

Adults may attend but cannot receive the coin.

The Saturday evening show will be produced by Ryan Bell again. Ryan is an Eagle Scout & Scouter from Burlington County Council. This show is not to be missed. Ryan has been responsible for past NJSP Camp-O-Ree shows as well as the 2010 National Jamboree OA Mysterium Compass, Times Square New York City Shining Light Ceremony simulcast from the 2010 National Jamboree. When Ryan is not busy helping scouts he is a stage manager on Broadway!

There will be a service Saturday morning for those of the Jewish faith and Sunday morning for Protestants (Episcopal, Presbyterian, Methodist, Lutheran etc.), Roman Catholics and Latter Day Saints. Locations will be announced as the event draws closer.

5. **Assignments:**

Sub-Camp Staff is expected to arrive Friday May 20th afternoon. Scout participants begin arriving Friday afternoon as their schools let out. In years past scouts have arrived as early as 2:00 pm.

Sub camp staffs are responsible to guide the troops to their designated sites as they arrive Friday. There are two areas to discuss regarding assignments. First, we would like to begin preliminary development of a duty roster for the sub-camp staff site. We have full staffing of the site throughout the weekend. Our staff will be available around the clock from Friday afternoon until Sunday 12 noon.

The NJSP Camp-O-Ree Staff have advised that they are attempting to develop communications link for all Sub-Camps, probably small hand held radios, between each sub-camp and the main headquarters site. In the discussions to date, it sounds as though they are going to try to establish a radio circuit or "net", with routine radio checks, etc. The Burlington County Council will also issue radios for our use if we can find an unused frequency.

The second area involves Tour Permits and "Head Counts". Contrary to what is published on page 6 of the 2011 Leaders Guide, The Burlington County Council does require that Tour Permits be completed by each attending unit for review and approval by The Burlington County Council. There have been some accountability problems during previous camporee, so for this event there will be a National Guardsman and State Trooper assigned to each sub-camp. They will be paired up with a volunteer from each sub-camp. As a "team", they will be totally responsible for each units Tour Permits and "up to date" Head Count Rosters. This will obviously require pre-event coordination between the council volunteer and each of the units that will be attending from council.

There should be an "up to date" roster for each unit maintained at the sub-camp staff site, as well as the Camporee Headquarters site. Each unit will be checked against the Head Count Roster and the Tour Permit will be checked upon entering the Sea Girt complex on Friday night. In addition, head counts will also be conducted on Saturday. Consequently, this will be a formidable responsibility and each member should consider their ability to fulfill this important position prior to volunteering.

A flag detail of scouts needs to be organized. This detail will raise and lower the council flag Friday, Saturday and Sunday according to the schedule. They will also help call attention to our Sub-Camp of the raising of the NJSP Camp-O-Ree Federal flag on the Parade Grounds. Ideally, this detail will consist of a bugler, and four scouts. One of the four scouts should have a voice that can project and be heard. He/she will call out the commands. This is not an assignment for a timid scout. The other three scouts will handle the raising and lowering of flags as necessary in a dignified and respectful manner.

Another important task for Sub-Camp staff is the mobilization and attendance of our units at the morning and evening ceremonies. The morning ceremonies will be more embellished than normal due to the number of dignitaries in attendance. There are plans for parachute drop, F-16 formation fly-over and a military band.

Col. Carl A. Williams Sub-Camp will host a "Beer and Dogs" social at the Sub-Camp from 1:00 - 4:00 pm. All Col. Carl A. Williams Sub-Camp staff, scouters and VIP's are encouraged to attend. You may invite others scouters from neighboring Sub-Camps. We need to dispense Root Beer and cook up some hot dogs provided courtesy of The Burlington County Council.

6. **Registration:**

The registration has been closed as of April 1, 2011. Attendance of scouts has passed the 8,000 mark. Over 2,000 Scouters, NJSP and NJ National Guard are also planning to participate and help out.

Burlington County Council has a very good showing of units and a reasonably good number of youth registered to attend.

There are a few registration issues that Nick is working to resolve with Jersey Shore Council. You may speak to him directly about the progress in these issues.

7. Location:

For those who use Global Positioning Systems (GPS) to find their way, the address to input for the NJSP Camp-O-REE is 100 Sea Girt Avenue, Sea Girt New Jersey. This will take you to the main entrance gate.

Burlington County Council has been designated the Colonel Carl A. Williams Sub-camp. At this point we don't have our Sub-Camp location on the parade grounds. The overall plotting of Troop sites within our Sub-Camp is a work in progress.

Another concern that developed at previous NJSP Camp-O-REE's, parking and loading/unloading, is being address by the Camp Staff. A designated parking area for one (1) unit trailers will be provided. Units should be advised that they will not be permitted to take their trailers to their campsite or to park them along the perimeter of the camp as they did in previous years. Each unit in attendance will receive One (1) trailer pass. You will receive a map during your initial check-in indicating where the cargo corral is located.

Likewise vehicles transporting scouts will be given parking passes (1 pass per 4 scouts). You will receive a map during your initial check-in indicating where the vehicle parking corral is located.

8. Logistics and Physical Arrangements:

The National Guard will once again provide a large octagonal military tent for our sub-camp staff site. Since our staff is too large to accommodate everyone in the large tent, there will be an area directly to the rear of the large tent for those who bring their own tents. Naturally, you can also stay with your respective units.

Gateways are not permitted at the Camp-O-REE. However, we will erect a flagpole for our council flag (This may be provided/erected by NJSP Staff?), a signpost (Think of M*A*S*H) and have one of our Centennial Council shoulder patch on display.

The NJSP Camp-O-REE Staff and Sub-Camp Staff will be provided with meal passes for the dining hall. Meal passes will be used from Friday Lunch until Sunday Breakfast. Of course sub-camp staff are free to dine with their Units as well.

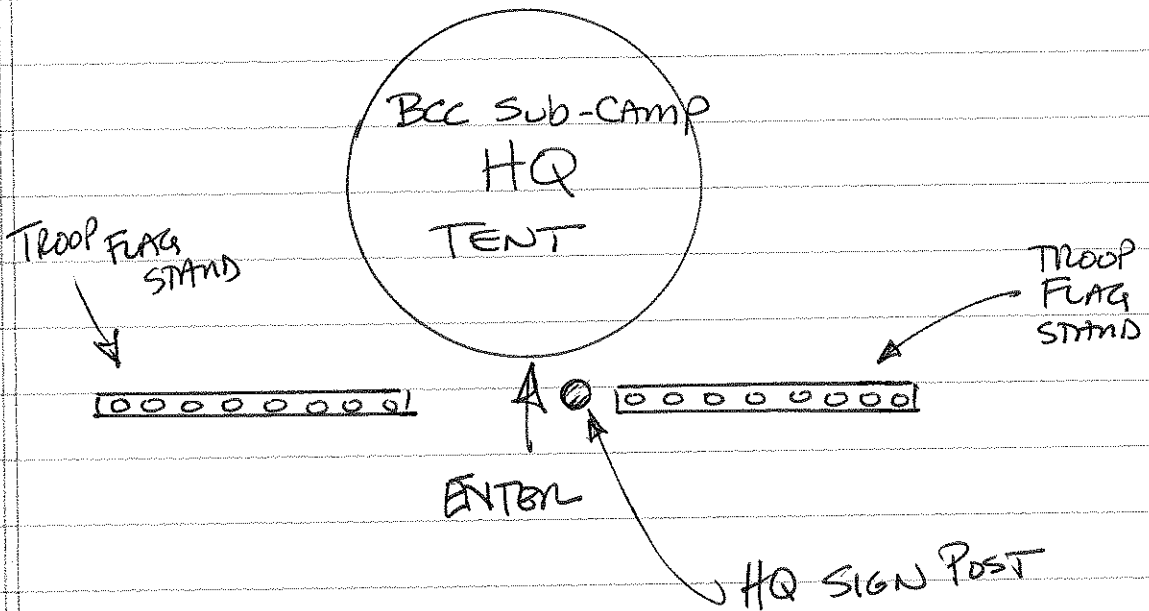

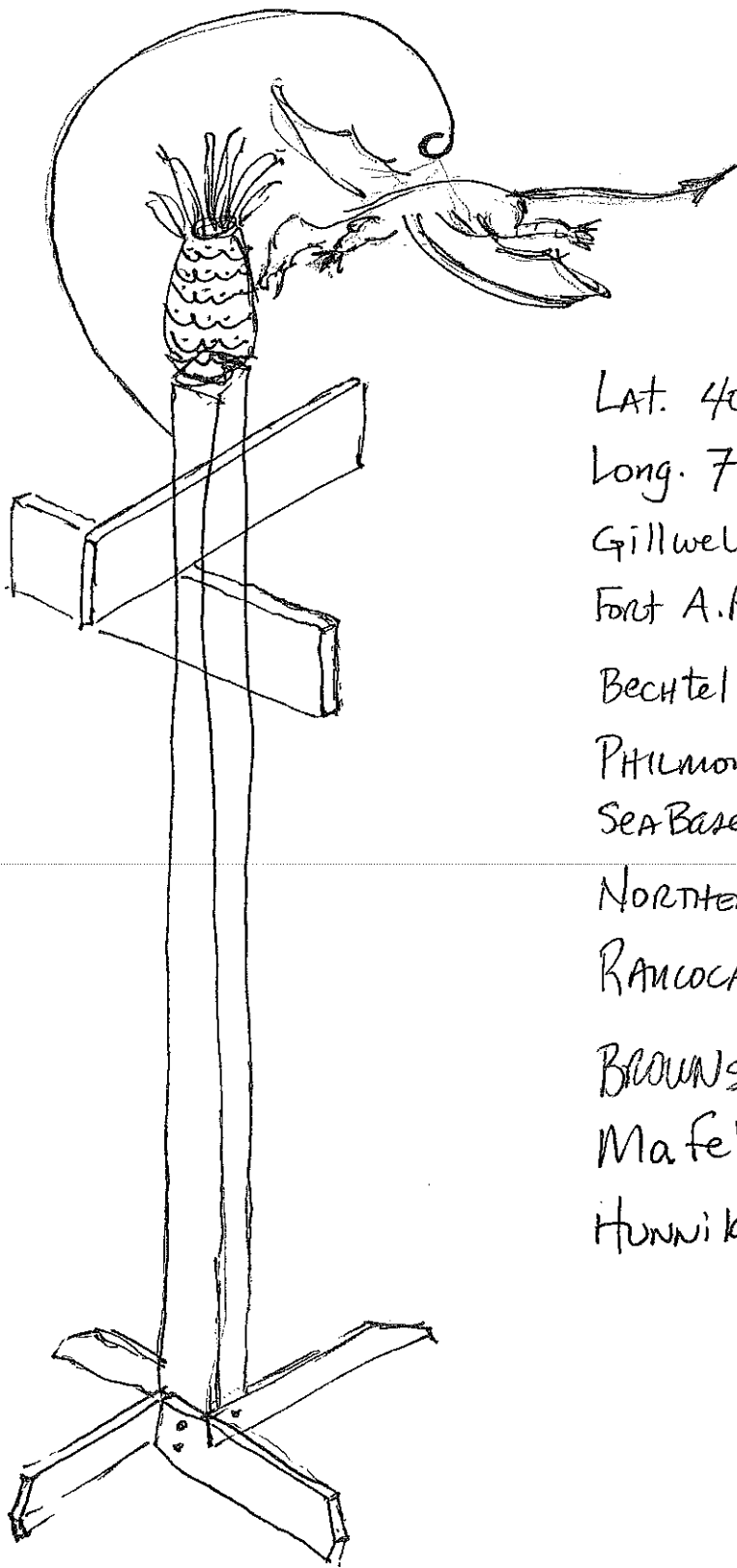
SIGN SPECIFICATIONS:

Material: 1" thick x 6" wide x 36" long No. 2 Pine.

Coatings: Seal all surfaces with an exterior grade primer. Finish all surfaces with an exterior grade latex or enamel in a semi-gloss finish.

Lettering: Can be painted, carved or raised. Suggested letter sizing is indicated in chart above.

Special Features: Try to incorporate a symbol of the destination into the sign. For example the Philmont brand, the OA Arrow, the Gilwell tartan pattern, a ship wheel for the Sea Base.

- What:** To determine the best Boy Scout Color Guard in New Jersey for 2007
- When:** The Championship will be decided at the October 5 to 7, 2007 New Jersey State Police Boy Scout Camporee at Sea Girt, NJ
- Who:** The Color Guard Championship Competition is opened to every Boy Scout Troop or Venture Crew registered for the 2007 New Jersey State Police Boy Scout Camporee
- Why:** Citizenship training is an important guiding principle in Scout training. Accordingly, teaching boys and young men how to properly conduct a flag ceremony is an important part of this citizenship training. This training has as an outcome, respect for our flag.

Who will conduct the Championship Competition:

The New Jersey National Guard has graciously agreed to judge this competition. Department of the Army, Drills and Ceremonies, Chapter 15 is the standard for the competition.

Practice: Boy Scout Troops and Venture Crews competing are invited to schedule practice time at their local National Guard facility. Of course, practice time is at the discretion of the local National Guard leadership and National Guard instructors.

Recognition:

Prizes will be given for first, second and third place in the championship. The judges ruling is final and will be awarded at the Saturday evening program, October 6 at the Camporee.

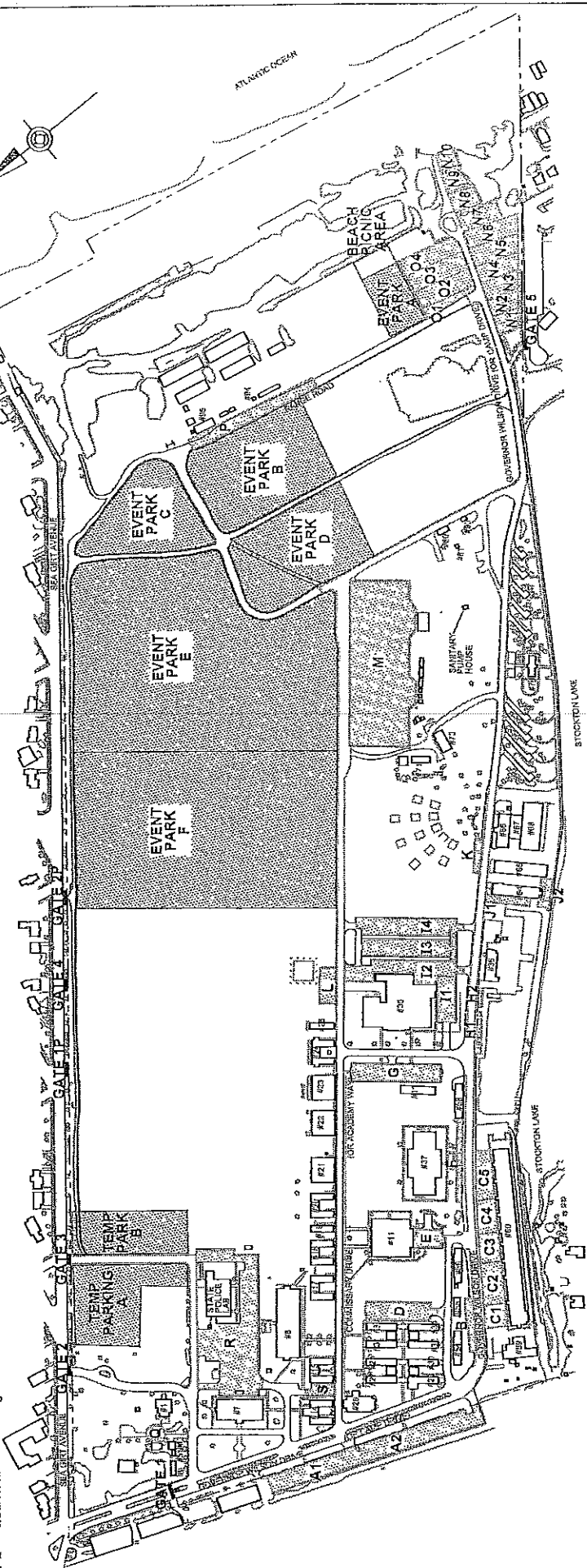

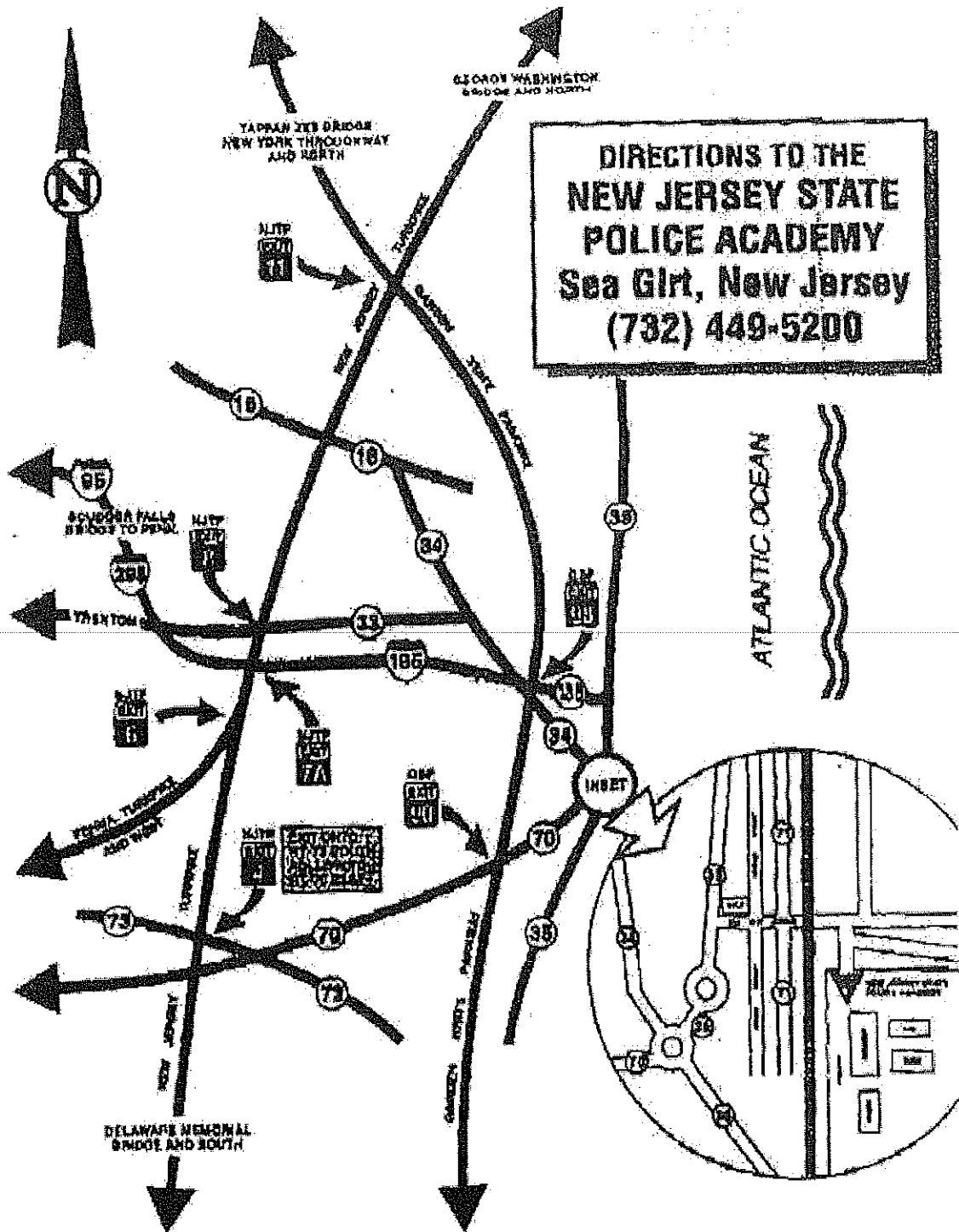

FROM THE NORTH

Take the Garden State Parkway South to Exit 98. Turn onto Route 138 East and continue through 4 traffic lights. Beyond the 4th traffic light turn onto Highway 35 South. FROM THE SOUTH

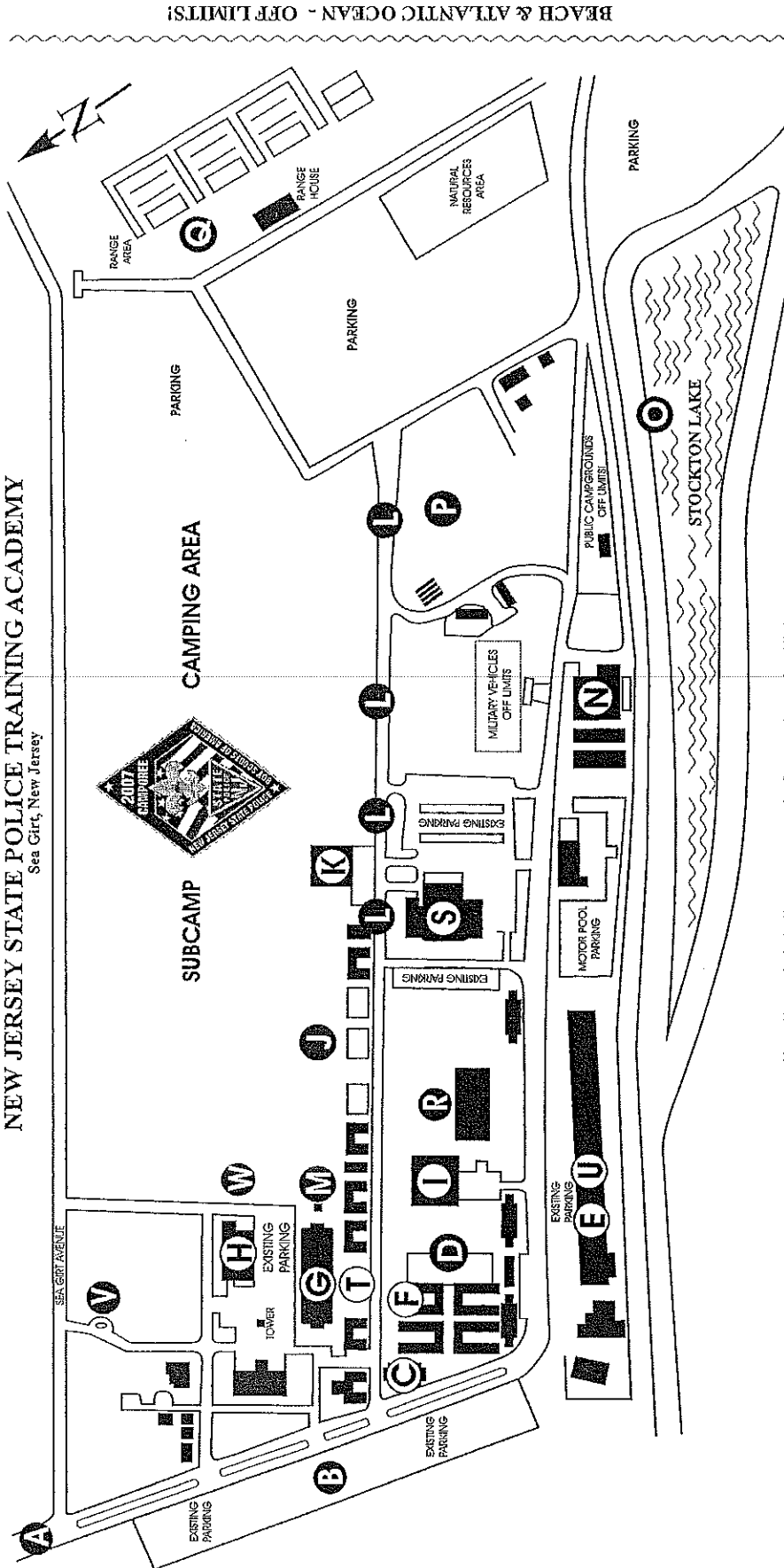
Take the Garden State Parkway North to Exit 98. Turn onto Route 138 East and follow directions above.
