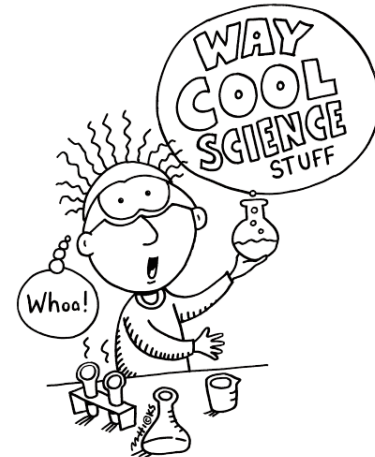


# Burlington County Council Cub-o-Ree 2010 Cub Science Investigators!

## Early Registration (by March 30<sup>st</sup>)

**Camping:** \$45 per Cub/Adult pair  
or \$65 Cub/Adult trio

**Day only:** \$40 Cub/Adult pair  
or \$60 Cub/Adult trio

## Regular Registration (after March 30<sup>st</sup>)

**Camping:** \$55 per Cub/Adult pair  
or \$75 Cub/Adult trio

**Day only:** \$50 Cub/Adult pair  
or \$70 Cub/Adult trio

### **Please bring the following:**

- Scout Uniform and/or Pack T-shirt
- **Very important:** Refillable water bottle or cup for drinking
- Rain gear (the events run rain or shine)
- Bug spray and/or sunscreen

### **To camp overnight Saturday, also bring:**

- Flashlight(s)
- Personal camping equipment (including tent and sleeping bags)
- Changes of clothing (bring extra)
- Sunday breakfast food & gear (propane, wood, or charcoal cooking)
- Personal hygiene & medication needs

### **Do NOT bring:**

- Liquid fuel (kerosene or white gas)
- Alcohol or illegal drugs
- Video games
- Fireworks or sparklers
- Firearms or ammunition
- Hunting or sheath knives  
(Cubs should not carry knives during activities)

### **General Information:**

- **All scouts camping overnight should be accompanied by a parent or adult. (No siblings please.)**  
(Note: with prior permission, parents may designate one other adult responsible for their son, **but no scout can share a tent with an adult who is not his parent or guardian.**)
- Scouts attending only for the day may attend as a den with 2-deep leadership.
- Saturday lunch and dinner will be provided. Plan your Sunday breakfast with your Pack or den.
- Check-in and camp set-up begins at 8:00 am Saturday. Upon arrival, you will be directed to your campsite. Each campsite may include different Packs to fill the campsite space.
- This is an outdoor, tent-camping experience. Cabins will be used for weather emergencies only.
- Saturday's activities begin with an Opening Flag Ceremony at 8:50 am in front of the Conference Center.
- Closing ceremony will take place Sunday at 9:00 am. Each campsite must be inspected before campers leave. Camp will close by 10 am Sunday.
- Camp rules apply to all participants and are designed to keep scouts safe while they have fun!
- Scouts can sign-out as needed to attend sports or other activities.
